### **COVID-19 CATCH UP PREMIUM PLAN**

Children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Those from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds will be among those hardest hit.

The government has announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up.

This includes:

- a one-off universal £650 million catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time.
- a £350 million National Tutoring Programme (NTP) to provide additional, targeted support for those children and young people who need the most help.

Schools' allocations will be calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in years Reception through to Year 11.

Therefore, North Newton will receive £8,240 based on 103 pupils.

- an initial part payment of 25% in autumn 2020, based on the latest available data - £2,060 Autumn first payment.
- a second grant payment of 33% in early 2021, estimated £2719 based on the October 2020 census. (The second grant payment will take account of the initial part payment made so that schools will receive a total of £46.67 per pupil across the first 2 payment rounds.)
- a further £33.33 per pupil will be paid during the summer term 2021.

As the catch-up premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), the grant will only be available for the 2020 to 2021 academic year. It will not be added to schools' baselines in calculating future years' funding allocations.
